Mike & Micki have been in Papua New Guinea since 1995, based at Goroka and in Mount Hagen, initially with their 4 sons - Andrew, Richard, Peter and Philip - who now live elsewhere.

As a pilot Mike's varied flying duties include emergency journeys ferrying sick people to hospital, taking mission workers, goods and groceries for trade stores, and building materials for community development projects to isolated areas. Return flights bring back vegetables and coffee beans to market. On top of regular pilot duties Mike is Training and Competency Manager, overseeing training for flight crews, as well as ensuring that their six-monthly aircraft proficiency checks are carried out.

A teacher by profession, Nicki runs courses for new expatriate staff in PNG's distinctive national language, Tok Pisin. She also provides hospitality to visiting pilots and teaches computer skills at the International School.

**Lebanon - Mike Bassous - Bible Society - Touch a Nation Partnership**

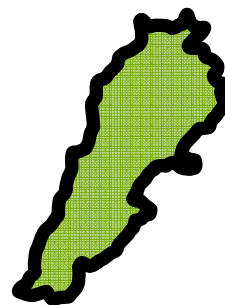

Mike Bassous is the General Secretary of the Bible Society in Lebanon.



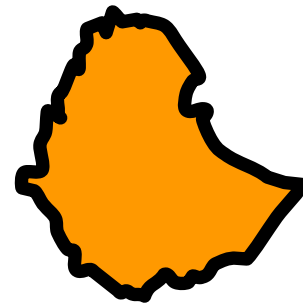

Maggie Crewes heads up RETRAK in Ethiopia, a work begun in 2006 to reach out to children on the streets and help rebuild their lives, restore their dignity and hope, release their potential and share with them the transforming love of Jesus. Her work is based in the capital of Ethiopia, Addis Ababa a city of around four million people. Thousands of children are driven to live on the streets of the city by factors such as poverty, family breakdown and AIDS.



Ethiopia, which hit the headlines especially after the Band and Live Aid initiatives in the 80's, still remains one of the poorest countries in Africa, and the high number of both adults and children begging in the streets, prompted local organisations to request the support from RETRAK in helping these children rebuild their lives.
